Meeting Called To Order: Tom Rush

Mr. Rush called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Public Comment/General Public Forum: None

Approval of Minutes: Tom Rush

Mr. Horner made the motion to approve the April 25, 2025 minutes, and Mr. Lacy seconded the motion with all board members in favor.

Financial Report: Paul Lynch and Tom Rush

- 1. Review of June Financials- Mr. Lynch stated that the Statement of Net Position, Bond Proceeds, Receivables and ETTL Expansion costs were recorded through pay app #11. Accounts Receivable included \$86,000 in government reimbursements outstanding, and Accounts Payable included over \$470,000 of amounts due to local governments. On the Statement of Revenues, Expenses and Changes in Net Position, the balance of Acct 336 Maintenance and Repairs-Equipment included \$19,000 in dozer repairs representing normal wear and tear on the equipment. The Debt Service expense line item was made up of one payment on the 2023 bond to the county.
- 2. Mr. Rush stated that the interest at LGIP is 4.28% and First Horizon dropped a little to 2.08%.

Manager's Report: Dennis Barnes

1. The TDEC inspection was done and stated we had litter everywhere. We have gotten what we could up, but with the wind blowing all the time, it is impossible not to have litter everywhere.

- 2. Mr. Barnes stated we had a fire on the excavator this month which caused some damage to the machine because of the Jones Fiber material. Mr. Barnes suggested that we quit taking it because it is ruining our machinery. After some discussion among the board members, Mr. Lacy made a motion to charge Jones Fiber \$15 a yard because of safety hazard issues with the material and will require a 48-hour notice to prepare the hole for it. Mr. Sliger seconded the motion with all board members in favor.
- **3.** Mr. Barnes stated that digging a ditch to keep people out of the area where fires are occurring would not work, so he is putting up some barbed wire with caution tape and placing tractor tires along there to keep people out.
- 4. Mr. Barnes stated that the camera for Class III has not been installed.

Engineer's Report: Steve Bostic

Mr. Bostic updated the board on the engineering projects going on at the Landfill (see attachment).

Mr. Bostic stated that he had written a "stop/pause-work" letter for ETTL. The board discussed the letter that was written, and Mr. Lacy stated that it was not appropriate and not what ETTL wanted. Mr. Lacy stated that it needs to be re-written and submitted to Attorney, Chris Capps. Mr. Bostic stated that Mr. Barnard from ETTL and himself would re-write the "stop/pause-work" letter.

Mr. Bostic did a change order for the excavation for ETTL. Mr. Sliger stated that we have adjusted one pay item that ETTL wanted. We will table the vote until Attorney; Chris Capps reviews it.

Mr. Bostic stated that he had two meetings with MUS. MUS wants a plan on the ammonia, and the report is due within the next 90 days.

Mr. Bostic stated that we have forever a chemical, PFAS (per-and polyfluoroalkyl substances used in stain repellents, non-stick cookware, and other products), that the EPA is considering WWTP discharge limits for the majority of the potential treatment methodologies to remove PFAS include a biproduct which is hazardous waste. MUS is watching the progress of the regulations closely. Presently, our limit that we can discharge to MUS is 25,000 gallons of leachate per day. We will need to purchase a tank to put in to capture the water to limit the pump station to 25,000 gallons a day, which we have exceeded three times in the last year. Mr. Sliger asked Mr. Bostic how much the tank would cost. A request is being made to TDEC to allow alternatives to the required 30 days of leachate storage as part of the expansion

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permitting. MUS will likely require a tank to store flow over 25,000 gallons per day, but it would not be as large as the TDEC required tank. The tank is around \$400,000 to store the TDEC required volume of leachate.

Mr. Bostic will do a resubmittal, hopefully next week, when Geos provides their response to the TDEC comments. They have work to do relative to the recently installed monitoring well.

Unfinished Business: Tom Rush

- 1. Mr. Rush stated that the board budget workshop will be held on Friday, June 6, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. at the Health Department to review the draft budget for the 2025-2026 fiscal year. Mr. Rush stated that we may need to consider an increase in the tipping fee, which is currently \$50 a ton, to \$55 or \$60 a ton to fund cost increases related to expansion and other capital needs. Larry Clark with the City of Morristown stated that he would have liked to have known this 3 months ago before they made their budget. Mr. Sliger stated that we now have a tank and rain flap to purchase that was not included in the budget.
- 2. Strate Insurance is still working on our quote because Travelers will no longer cover landfills. They project a 20% to 25% increase on insurance.
- **3.** Mr. Rush stated that the ACH policy will be brought back next month after it has been approved by Attorney, Chris Capps, TN Comptrollers, and accountants.
- **4.** Ms. Clonce has submitted an ACH policy to the TN Comptrollers, Attorney, Chris Capps, Ms. Hemminger and Mr. Rush for changes and will bring that back to the June Meeting for approval by the board.

New Business: Tom Rush

1. Mr. Rush stated that we had an emergency with the dozer repairs. Mr. Barnes received a quote for \$50,000 and needed a motion to get it repaired. Mr. Lacy made a motion to approve the repair and cap at \$50,000, and Mr. McGuffin seconded the motion with all board members in favor.

Adjournment: Tom Rush

Mr. Rush adjourned the meeting at 10:15 a.m. Mr. Horner made a motion to adjourn the meeting, and Mr. Lacy seconded the motion with all board members in favor.

Dear Mr. Sliger,

In response to your request for a preliminary budget for the Construction Quality Assurance (CQA) effort associated with the construction CQA budget of \$400,000, which we believe is sufficient to cover the required quality assurance activities, including material testing, field experience with similar projects. Given the absence of a finalized construction schedule at this stage, we have developed this estimate considering the design complexity, existing subgrade conditions, and the anticipated size of the landfill cell. ACH payment option

Description

Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste office will be activating the ACH/DEBIT payment option for receipt of customer payments and disbursement of vendor payments.

If ACH/Debit payment is preferred, customer payments will credit our bank account via the payment option selected with First Horizon Bank software. This will not change the normal invoicing process used for customers up to the point of receiving payment.

Selected vendor payments will debit our bank account with First Horizon Bank software. This will not change the normal bill payment process used for vendor payments up to the point of creating disbursement. For vendor payments to be paid electronically, an ACH file will be created which will be uploaded through a secure portal to First Horizon Bank that currently processes direct deposits for payroll. The bank's software will assign each disbursement its own number in the form of a remittance number, which will appear on the General Ledger as the transaction number.

Policies, Procedures, & Controls for Vendor ACH Payments

For vendor payments, ACH payments will be handled exactly as disbursements made by check - the payment register will be used as a pre-disbursal listing to check that each bill assigned to each vendor has been properly entered and assigned. This pre-disbursal procedure will happen concurrently with the similar process that is used for physical check payments currently. The payment register procedure will be completed by an employee who was not involved in either the input of the vendor bills nor the "printing" of the disbursements. Any errors found relating to ACH payments will be voided within the system, reissued, and a new ACH file will be created; all will be completed prior to submission to the bank for final disbursement.

Drafting Customer Bank Accounts

This is to notify you of our plan to accept electronic funds transfer for payment on customer accounts via ACH/DEBIT which will credit our bank account. The customer will be given several options in choosing how they would like to set up their payment information through the First Horizon Bank website in order for us to have the authority to process the transaction. First Horizon Bank will be our banking software source for the ACH transaction, and we will be using QuickBooks software for our department's system receipting. We will use First Horizon Bank's cash management system (the same system that has been used by Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste for payroll transactions for many years and is a safe and secure gateway to handle sensitive data). The Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste office staff will have a separate cash management login that will allow for the required building and initiating capabilities. This service will be offered within the current resources of the office.

Implementation Cost

Activation of the ACH payment option within the software will add no additional costs to the Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste office. The banking fee associated with ACH payments are expected to be substantially lower than the current costs associated with mailing checks: postage, envelopes, check stock, etc.

Implementation Timeline

Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste office plans to implement this process on July 1, 2025, or as soon as approved by its Board and the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury.

Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste Electronic Business System Policy Pre-Implementation Statement Effective July 1, 2025

In accordance with Section 47-10-119, the Tennessee Code Annotated, the Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste submits a pre-implementation statement to accept customer credit/debit cards, ACH/Debit and e/checks as well as issue vendor ACH payments via the internet through First Horizon Bank, which has their own Electronic Bill Payment product (it is not outsourced or provided by a third party).

- 1. Customer credit card processing is provided by Elavon at a 3% surcharge. OuickBooks is used for customer and vendor payment recordkeeping.
- 2. Policies and procedures for customer payments are as follows:
 - Customers can pay at the Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste office by credit/debit card, cash, or check. The Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste Office Manager or Director will process the payments in the QuickBooks system as received.
 - Customers can make a payment by e/check through First Horizon Bank. The Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste Office Manager or Director will download the payments every day from First Horizon Bank and process in the QuickBooks system as received.
 - Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste does not store or have access to any customer credit card information.
- 3. Policies and procedures for vendor payments are as follows:
 - Vendor payments may be made via the issuance of a physical check or ACH.
 - There are three signers on account. Just as two signatures are required for physical checks, two signers will have to log into the First Horizon Bank system to approve payments being made electronically by means of ACH before they will process.
- 4. The Hamblen County/Morristown Solid Waste Office Manager is responsible for daily downloading of the online transactions. In the event of her absence, the Director will be sharing this responsibility.
- 5. Benefits of this system will be a convenience for the customer and an eventual relief of workload using electronic payment rather than payment in person or via U.S. Mail. Our auditors Clearpoint CPAS PC, formerly Rodefer Moss & Company, highly recommend using this electronic system instead of paper.

CONTRACT AMENDMENT

This Agreement is entered into this _____ day of May, 2025 by and between THE HAMBLEN COUNTY-MORRISTOWN SOLID WASTE DISPOSAL SYSTEM ("Owner"), and EAST TENNESSEE TURF & LANDSCAPE ("Contractor").

WHEREAS, Owner and Contractor entered into a construction contract dated March 26, 2024, (the "Contract") for the Class 1, Phase 3, Landfill Expansion (New Cell); and,

WHEREAS, Owner issued the Notice to Proceed dated May 1, 2024, notifying Contractor that contract time was to commence on May 20, 2024, and the project was to be substantially completed by December 16, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, Contractor commenced work on May 20, 2024, and devoted substantial equipment and personnel to ensure the project was completed by the contracted date knowing the concerns for lack of space in the existing Class 1 cell; and,

WHEREAS, Owner and Contractor agreed to the terms of the contract and commenced the project while awaiting for the approved permit from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation on the expansion project with the understanding and expectation that the permit was to be approved in August 2024; and,

WHEREAS, Contractor agreed to scale back on the project and the Owner agreed to add an additional two hundred and forty (240) days to the executed contract at its September 20, 2024, Board meeting once it was known that the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation had not approved the permit and the Board was informed that it would be at least six to eight months before the permit could be approved; and

WHEREAS, of the date of this Contract Amendment, the Owner and Contractor have been informed that it could be several more months before the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conversation could approve the permit; and

WHEREAS, Owner and Contractor desire to see the project to its finish to amend the terms of the contract including terms applicable to the suspension of work under Article 15 of the Standard General Conditions of the Construction Contract

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants and promises hereinafter set forth, it is agreed as follows:

- 1. The language under Article 15 of the Standard General Conditions of the Construction Contract shall remove "... for a period of not more than 90 consecutive days" and add the language "until which time an approved permit is received from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation".
- 2. The Owner hereby temporarily suspends work on the project until an approved permit is received from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation.
- 3. The Owner hereby approves Contractor to continue work on the removal of material from within the new cell even during this temporary suspension of work. This is to ensure that the new cell is best prepared for the import of materials and other construction activities upon the receipt of an approved permit from the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation.
- 4. The Owner and Contractor agree that no other work is to be completed on the project during this temporary suspension of work unless it is approved by the Chairman of the Board and the Director of Owner.
- 5. The Owner understands that with this temporary suspension of work that additional costs will be occurred. There will be the cost of remobilization contained in the original agreement, and there may be escalation in prices from subcontractors and vendors, cost of living adjustments, etc. The Contractor agrees to minimize these additional costs to the greatest extent possible.
- 6. The Contractor warrants to Owner that upon receipt of notification that the temporary suspension of work has been lifted by the Owner that work will commence within 30 business days. Nothing contained in this agreement shall preclude the parties agreement to any piecemeal work that might be necessary prior to receipt of the permit from TDEC and without remobilization.
- 7. The Contractor and Owner agree that all language of the contract will remain intact and shall work together to ensure the project is completed within the designated number of days.
- 8. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Tennessee without regard to its conflict of law principles.

Dennis, here is the information regarding any governmental purchase.

I am confirming full details and getting your quote/approval information as we speak. The second I have more of that I will shoot it your way. "For governmental entities, we are only able to offer Governmental Leases (with mandatory purchase option) or Tax Leases (CVO or FMV). This is because these entities cannot take on debt.

With Governmental Leases, there are a couple of nuanced attributes compared to traditional leases.

- 1. The purchase option is mandatory. However, it can be as low as \$1 or high as 110% of the residual value.
- There is a minimum of a 24 month term
- 3. The rate is 5.49%, regardless of term
- 4. There is additional documentation required:

1. Authorizing Resolution or Meeting Minutes OR Legal Opinion

- i. If Meeting Minutes are provided, they must include the approval by the board to purchase or lease the specific machine in the docs, model, serial number, amount financed and term
 - ii. If Government Resolution is used, the bottom must be signed by a clerk or secretary of the entity and that person authorized who signs the documents.

iii. If using Legal Opinion, the Cat Financial Legal Counsel Form will need to be signed by the entity's legal counsel"
